Presentation

Former CCAS President Gary Derman gave a lecture entitled "Einstein's Telescope". His talk was inspired by a recent book by author Evalyn Gates. Gary described in detail the effect of gravitational lensing.

This effect is formed when the light from a very distant bright source is "bent" around a massive object between the source object and the observer. It is sometimes called the Einstein ring. The effect can cause a single object to appear as multiple objects. The concepts of dark matter and dark energy and their relationship were also discussed.
